
Why would YMCA residents choose to embrace a two-month volunteering placement during lockdown?

JOY in the Business Development Department

Joy has always been part of my life. I can remember as far back as aged 6, singing in Sunday School, I've got the JOY, JOY, JOY, JOY, down in my heart. We sang it in a "round" like a camp-fire song. As an teenager, aged 17, I taught younger children in a Summer holiday Bible School, and the memory verse was from the Psalms 'In your presence is fullness of Joy'.

In 2016, the year our son Simon was diagnosed with terminal cancer, this became very real. A favourite Bible verse was, 'The Joy of the Lord is my strength', I decided I would choose Joy. YMCA also called the Intranet 'Joy' that year after I won the name ballot! Those of you who know me well have heard many of the stories, where I have found Joy in the most unusual places, Scotland, Lincoln, Singapore, Budapest, Australia, as it travelled with me, in my heart. At work I became known as 'The Joy Lady'.

Joy was always there before maybe, I just wasn't looking for it.

More recently due to the COVID 19 outbreak which involves home working, job change and working closely with my work colleague, Val, who was also home schooling, we had several interesting conversations in the course of my work.

My new role was to assist Val, our Bid Writer, and do research for her. This was a learning curve for me and involved several calls to Val. One day in my eagerness to get a very small bid submitted, I uploaded the wrong document and could not retract it. I sent them an email, but it would be amongst hundreds and prayed. The next day they emailed back, sorted my mistake and 2 weeks later there was Joy when I got £500 for YMCAB!

Another day, as a distraction for the Val's children, I asked her daughter, Tilly, if she would draw me a rainbow picture to put in my window. As I live on a main road close to the hospital, I told her it would be seen by all the buses, ambulances, police, and those who walk along the road. Several days later a handmade envelope arrived and inside a beautiful painting by Tilly. This was in beautiful rainbow colours and written in her writing the words, 'Choose Joy'.

A few days later, during a phone call, I thanked and told her that I would be taking it outside to show the neighbours and the ambulances as they passed by. This happened the following Thursday, "Clapping Night"! I was, of course, complete with my pot lids and making a joyful noise. I have another Psalm, 47. I now call it "The Thursday Psalm"; - "Clap your hands all ye nations shout to God with cries of Joy", and Psalm 81, "Sing for Joy to God our strength, ... begin the music with flute, tambourine, lyre and (pot lids)".

These are very unusual times where we have all had to make choices. The choice is always ours, whether we choose to act on it or not. JOY is also a choice and the choice is ours. As Val and I have worked on the bids, there have been several days where we have had to make such choices - sudden deadlines, rejection, computer failures. I am pleased to say Joy has always appeared just when I/we have needed it.

Local Collaboration At Its Best!

When The Poole Grammar School took up the national call for additional and much needed Personal Protective Equipment, by utilising what they had in their Design Technology area, they came across one obstacle...Boxes!

Boxes to store and deliver their self-made PPE Masks to local Surgeries, Care Homes and the YMCA. This is where YMCA Bournemouth/Poole used it's contacts and upon receiving



the request from the Grammar School, the very next day Castlepoint's Store & Secure Company delivered the required boxes to the School. YMCA Bournemouth/Poole have been supported by both The Poole Grammar School and Store & Secure in their challenge to end local homelessness, and it was simply a matter of all the parties working together to meet the national/local need in the present time.
